### What does AWANA Mean?

AWANA is an acronym for **Approved Workmen Are Not Ashamed**, from 2 Timothy 2:15. It is an international evangelical nonprofit organization whose goal is to reach children so they would come to know, love and serve Jesus Christ as Lord.

### What is AWANA?

The AWANA program is designed to motivate your children to learn about God by memorizing scripture. Each child will work through a series of books at their own pace. As the children learn verses they will earn awards including uniforms, patches and badges. Parents are encouraged to work with their child during the week on the verses they are memorizing. It is important for the parents to help their child keep track of their AWANA handbooks and uniforms and encourage them to bring them along with their Bible to every meeting.

### How is the time divided for the evening?



#### Hand Book Time:

Leaders work with small groups of clubbers, listening to the Bible verses they learned during the week. Hand book

time provides an opportunity for building friendships and allows leaders to mentor children and help them understand the Bible verses they memorize.

### Game Time:

The game time is a fun and exciting time where clubbers play special games on the AWANA Circle. The clubbers will have an opportunity later in the year to use the games they learned to participate in Sparks-a-Rama or the AWANAGames™.



### Council Time:

During Council Time children learn how to apply Christian principles to their lives. We will have speakers, videos and Bible stories during this time.

### What are the Special Events?



**AWANA Grand Prix:** During the AWANA season the kids will have an opportunity to build racers from

car kits and race the cars against each other on an official AWANA sanctioned track. This exciting event is one of the most popular activities for children and their families.

### The AWANAGames & Sparks-a-Rama:

AWANAGames™ pits clubs from local churches in competition. Sparks-a-Rama is a Sparks version of AwanaGames™ but with less intense competition. Both events focus on fun and meeting new friends through playing

games. Emphasis is also placed on learning sportsmanship from a biblical perspective.
